We are delighted to celebrate the achievements of our Year 5 pupils, who have been shining in science and sharing their learning with confidence. Drake, Yuvan, Kaysen, Alexander, Jorsh, Dev, Aayush, Ayaan, Khrystyna, Arya, Sarrinah and Hena demonstrated their growing knowledge of the solar system by preparing and delivering confident presentations in the KS1 and KS2 assemblies. Their enthusiasm and teamwork brought science to life, inspiring pupils and encouraging them to recall facts with excitement. Together, the children showcased not only their scientific understanding but also their confidence to present and celebrate learning across our school community. It was a wonderful celebration of science and pupil achievement.



Year 2 had a fantastic time on their trip to Hounslow Urban Farm! The day began with an engaging farm talk where children learned all about life on the farm and had the chance to meet a variety of animals up close. They loved observing and discussing familiar favourites such as chickens, rabbits, owls and guinea pigs, and were full of thoughtful questions about how each animal lives and is cared for.

Later, the excitement grew during the exotic animal talk. With guidance from the knowledgeable farm staff, the children were thrilled to hold and handle creatures they don't often see in everyday life. From snakes and lizards to tarantulas, stick insects and even cockroaches, the experience sparked curiosity and confidence as pupils discovered new textures, movements and facts.



Year 1 scientists impressed us this week with their experiment on absorbency. The children explored how different materials respond to water, carefully testing plastic, foil, cardboard and cotton balls. They learnt to use equipment purposefully, counting drops with pipettes and timing with stopwatches to ensure accurate results. Pupils discussed why each tool was suitable for the job and confidently applied key scientific vocabulary such as "absorbency." It was wonderful to see them working like real investigators, recording their findings and sharing ideas. Their enthusiasm and teamwork shone through, making science both practical and memorable for everyone involved.



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Year 3 recently enjoyed an educational and memorable trip to the Ram Mandir in Southall as part of their Autumn term learning about Hinduism. The visit helped bring their classroom lessons to life, giving the children a chance to experience a Hindu temple first-hand. During the visit, they observed the beautifully decorated deities and listened attentively as the priest explained their meanings and significance within Hindu worship. The children were highly engaged, showing great curiosity and respect as they asked thoughtful questions to deepen their understanding. They especially enjoyed seeing the temple environment, hearing the traditional sounds, and learning about the customs followed by Hindus. Back at school, the pupils expressed their learning creatively by drawing detailed sketches of the Hindu deities they had seen. Overall, the trip was a valuable experience that enriched their knowledge and appreciation of Hinduism.



Year 3 had a fantastic time exploring animal diets through an imaginative role-play lesson. Pupils wore colourful animal masks and stepped into character as lions, rabbits, bears, chickens, and cows. They then "visited" the classroom cafés, Carnivore Café, Herbivore Café, and Omnivore Café, to order food that matched their animal's diet. This playful activity helped children discover which animals are herbivores, carnivores, or omnivores. Well done to Year 3!

Year 2 has been busy exploring the properties of materials! The children tested a range of everyday items to see if they could twist, bend, squash or stretch. They carefully recorded their results and discussed why certain materials are chosen for specific jobs. For example, rubber can stretch to make elastic bands. This hands-on investigation helped pupils think like scientists, asking questions, testing ideas, and linking their discoveries to real life.



We kicked off the festive activities here at Edison in the best possible way, with our very own Santa Dash! This special event replaced the usual Daily Mile we complete during our PE sessions, adding an extra burst of excitement to the school day. During our break time, the playground was transformed into a festive fiesta, with the school speaker blasting all the Christmas classics as pupils and staff headed out to complete their mile. There was plenty of dancing, singing, and smiling along the route, and even a fantastic teacher duet from Mr Nemo and Mrs Vakada that had everyone cheering and joining in. It was a wonderful way to launch the holiday season and bring our whole school community together. A huge thank you to Miss Fehres, Mr Fletcher and Miss Weddell for organising such a joyful start to our festive fun!
