

IGNITING YOUNG MINDS, FOR A BRIGHTER TOMORROW

Reception did a fantastic job making their own minibeast fossils. The children strengthened their fine motor skills by rolling and pressing playdough, explored textures and patterns left by different creatures, used early scientific vocabulary such as “imprint” and “pattern”, and talked confidently about what they noticed during the activity.



During Arts and Crafts Club, the children have been learning about the artwork of Claude Monet, focusing on his famous painting series, *Water Lilies*. Inspired by Monet’s beautiful use of colour and nature, the children created their own lily pads using paper plates and a range of materials including tissue paper, paint, and card. They enjoyed experimenting with different textures and creative techniques to design their artwork. The activity encouraged imagination, creativity, and fine motor skills, and the children were very proud of their finished pieces inspired by Monet’s iconic paintings.



Over this half term all children in KS1 and KS2 have been demonstrating fantastic cricket ability learning to bat either from a batting tee for support or encouraging batting after a bounce moving their feet to successfully score runs. They have also been learning to bowl either using an under-arm technique or a full over-arm technique aiming for one bounce to hit the wicket.

Also, all children have been taking part in thrilling sports day practices with jumping, throwing javelins, balancing and sprint races both individual and team relays to have their skills on full display at their sports day.

The children have had a lovely week exploring *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. They have been retelling the story using their own words and actions, helping them build confidence with sequencing and new vocabulary.

They also enjoyed a food-tasting activity inspired by the caterpillar's journey, talking about the colours, textures, and flavours of each item.

One of the highlights has been observing real caterpillars in our classroom. The children have been watching them closely each day and noticing how they grow and change, giving them a hands-on introduction to life cycles.
