Reception – Newton Class

They attended the live Zoom session with our chosen author, learnt about Money in Maths, People who Help us in the Community for English and all about the season of Spring! We dressed up as superheros for Comic relief and our favourite book characters for world book day! Reception – Bell Class

It has been a somewhat unusual and challenging term with a combination of remote and school learning. Remote learning consisted of daily zoom lessons and Seesaw activities in English, Maths and Phonics with a blend of art, Science and PSHE lessons. Around 70% children accessed online learning and 20% children attended school. Children had the opportunity to celebrate World book Day by dressing up as their favourite book character and were also lucky enough to have the author, Serena Patel lead a remote workshop to promote her books. She was so impressed by our pupils and the well-thought out and perceptive questions that they asked. We really appreciate parental involvement considering how difficult it was for them to juggle everything when learning at home and we value all their efforts and achievements. The children have been equally cooperative and enthusiastic about this new approach to learning.



Year 1 – Watson Class

This term, in National Science Week, Watson class has been investigating the properties of materials by carrying out different experiments. We also learnt about Jane Goodall and how she observed and investigated the chimpanzees in Africa.

In English, Watson class has been learning about the differences between Fiction and Non-Fiction books and identifying their features.



Year 1 – Franklin Class

This term Franklin were involved in science week. We took part in an investigation involving milk, food colouring and washing up liquid. The children had to predict what would happen if all the ingredients were mixed together. Can you guess what Happens?



Year 2 – Pasteur Class

Pasteur class have really enjoyed reading stories as a class and this was expressed during world book day. The children were eager to learn and were keen to get involved with discussions and ask questions. In particular, they expressed their interest when the author Serena Patel virtually visited them. 
Year 3 – Curie Class

Year 4 – Goodall Class

Goodall class has had scintillating experiences since getting back to school this half-term. We have completed a plethora of science investigations this half-term based on our topic 'States of Matter' investigating how different states of matter behave. In topic, we have been learning about our local area in our unit 'Heart of Hounslow'. We have had rich discussions on why people move to certain areas and why/how having Heathrow nearby impacts us. Our focus in R.E. has been to learn about 'Forgiveness' which focused on teachings of Jesus to forgive others and worked well with our PSHE unit on 'Friendships'. Student well-being has been at the heart of our learning this half-term. We wrote Haikus, diary entries and created artwork to express our feelings about the lockdown. Our science experiences have been enriched through lots of science discussions during the Science week and zoom workshop with a marine biologist. We learnt a lot about why/how plastic pollution is impacting us and what we need to further do to secure our future. Our science ambassadors, along with the help of others, have planted seeds for the new addition to our school ground: The Vegetable Patch. We also consolidated our learning of Science at the end of the unit by playing an Escape Room activity, which was riveting. Additionally, we took part in 'Wander in the Woods' story writing competitions and 23 pupils from Goodall class have been selected to have their stories published in a book. Finally, we look forward to a bright and sunny Summer term bringing much needed sunshine to everyone's lives.



Year 4 – Carson Class

Carson class has had another delightful term with a range of fun-filled activities. In Science we have been learning all about the different states of matter and went from conducting investigations on zoom to conducting our very own in the classroom. We were also lucky enough to have a zoom workshop with a marine biologist! The children learnt lots of information about plastic pollution and how we can help our planet by reusing and recycling objects. We also dressed up as our favourite superheroes to raise money for comic relief! Not only was it a fantastic cause, but the children were also able to write their own comics which starred their own hero, which was a wonderful success. During English, the children have been incredibly engaged in reading Varjak Paw; whilst also creating some wonderful pieces of writing; including a diary entry and persuasive letter, based on story. They cannot wait to find out what happens next... The children also took part in the Young Writers competition; of which 22 of the children will now have their books published in a book! Carson has had a very busy and rewarding half-term and we are looking forward to lots of outdoor learning when we return.
