Set against the backdrop of Ally and Leli's tender love story, Song Beneath the Tides is a sophisticated story that both looks back at colonialism, and also explores the modern issues of poverty and cultural devastation caused by big business and mass tourism.

Cowell, Catherine	Ernest Simba	Years 5 & 6	Africa	Liwida the lizard is Ernest's best and only real friend as he grows up, disabled, in the African orphanage where he was abandoned as a baby, and Liwida can do amazing things...
Davies, Nicola	Rubbish Town Hero	Years 5 & 6	Africa	Chipo and his little sister live on Papa Fudu's dumpsite in Rubbish Town, scouring it for valuables to sell. When they find something that Papa Fudu wants for himself they realise that it's time to leave and find a new home for themselves...
Davies, Steven	Blood and Ink	Years 7 and up	Mali, Islam	Set in 2012, militant Islamic group Ansar Dine is preparing to capture Timbuktu. Ali is 16 and a Mujahid, a holy warrior, who finds himself scaling the walls of the city. Inside is fifteen year old Kadija, daughter of a guardian of the sacred manuscripts of the ancient city. Ali must declare forbidden everything Kadija holds precious – music, dancing, her books. Kadija refuses to give in, and Ali finds himself drawn to her. Both have conflicting feelings for each other, how will they choose the course to follow?
Forna, Namina	The Gilded Ones	Years 7 and up	West Africa (fictionalised), Afrofuturism	Sixteen-year-old Deka lives in fear of the blood ceremony that will determine whether she will become a member of her village. But on the day of the ceremony, her blood runs gold, the color of impurity - and Deka knows she will face a consequence worse than death .The Gilded Ones is a empowering fantasy tale that deals racism, misogyny, inequality and much more.
Gibbons, Alan	The Lion roars	Years 5 & 6	Senegal	Jimi knows the names of all the great African footballers, and he wants nothing more than to wear the kit of the Lions of Senegal. Can his daydreams be more than just dreams?
Laird, Elizabeth	The Fastest Boy in the World	Years 5 & 6	Ethiopia	Solomon loves to run and dreams of winning a gold medal, but when his grandfather collapses, Solomon is the only one who can run for help. Can he last the distance?

Laird, Elizabeth	The Prince Who Walked with Lions	Years 6 and up	Ethiopia, historical setting	The British Army is circling the stronghold of the King of Abyssinia. Under orders from Queen Victoria, its mission is to rescue the British Envoy who is held prisoner. Watching with terror and awe is the king's young son, Alamyu. He knows that his father is as brave as a lion, but how on earth can he stand against the foreigners?
Lewis, Gill	Gorilla Dawn	Years 5 & 6	D. R. Congo	The forests of the Democratic Republic of Congo are the home of the gorillas. They are also a land rich in resources that fuel internal conflict. When rebel soldiers capture a baby gorilla with the intention of selling it into captivity, two children, also imprisoned, find the courage to make a break for freedom and return the gorilla to the wild.
Naidoo, Beverley	Burn My Heart	Years 5 & 6	Kenya	The Mau Mau – the name of a secret society that once struck terror into the hearts of British settlers in Kenya. An episode in history that ended in a State of Emergency, with violent and brutal acts dividing a nation. This is an intensely personal and vivid story of two boys: one black, one white. Once they were friends even though their circumstances are very different. But in a country riven by fear and prejudice, even the best of friends can betray one another . . .
Orji, Dinah	Children of the Benin Kingdom	Years 5 & 6	Benin	Papa Eze found Ada as a baby in the forest, and brought her up as his own. She's always known this, but now she is 12, it is time for him to tell her the whole truth about where she is from - a truth that sends her on a journey deep into the rainforest to the ancient Edo kingdom of Benin.
Raina, Arushi	When Morning Comes	Years 7 and up	South Africa	It's 1976 in South Africa, and four young people are living in Johannesburg and its black township, Soweto: Zanele, a black female student organizer; Meena, a South Asian girl working at her father's shop; Jack, an Oxford-bound white student; and Thabo, a teen-gang member, or tsotsi. From each of their points of view, this book explores the roots of the Soweto Uprising and the edifice of apartheid in a South Africa about to explode.



Rashid, Leila	Empire's End: A Roman Story	Years 5 & 6	North Africa, Roman Empire, historical Setting	The Roman Empire 207 AD – Camilla's family are called to the Emperor's side from their home in North Africa, but instead of Rome, Camilla's family are sent to the furthest corner of the Empire, Britannica. After a traumatic journey, tragedy strikes and Camilla finds herself alone, navigating life in a cold and dangerous land at the mercy of a capricious Empress. Based on a true story, we see that Roman Britain was a cultural 'melting pot' with a mix of ethnicities and religions at all levels of society.
Riordan, James	Blood Runner	Years 7 and up	South Africa	A story inspired by Josiah Thugwane who, at Atlanta in 1996, became the first black South African to win an Olympic gold medal. Sam sees his parents and sister killed by the police in a bloody massacre, but chooses a different way to retaliate.
Robert, Na'ima B	Far From Home	Years 7 and up	Zimbabwe	Tariro and Katie are two very different girls both living in Zimbabwe a generation apart. Tariro lives through the colonial era and the oppression that brought, and Katie, child of a white settler, through independence and experiences oppression of a different sort.
Wallace, Jason	Out of Shadows	Years 7 and up	Zimbabwe	In 1980s Zimbabwe, independence offers land and hope to Black Africans, but Robert, newly arrived at boarding school, finds there are still battles to be fought with the white boys who want their old country back.

Alston, BB	Amari and the Night Brothers	Years 5 and up	African American, Fantasy	When Amari gets an invitation to the Bureau of Supernatural Affairs she has to get her head around the new world of the Bureau, where mermaids, aliens and magicians are real. Amari must compete against kids who've known about the supernatural world their whole lives, and when each trainee is awarded a special supernatural talent, Amari is given an illegal talent – one that the Bureau views as dangerous.

Zoe's never asked herself this question until a letter arrives from her father on her twelfth birthday. She's never met her father. He was sent to prison before she was born.
