Reception

In Maths we covered many topics, including odd and even doubling and halving numbers. What fun!

There were also two very exciting days this half term - Sports Day and our trip to the Discovery Centre! Sports Day was so much fun - we had a good time in the afternoon running around, taking part in so many interesting activities.

<u>Year 1</u>

Year 1 had a fantastic year. We thoroughly enjoyed the planned activities and learning that took place. All pupils enjoyed the investigations which took place inside and outside the classrooms.

Pupil also enjoyed school trips to the church and Bekonscott Model Village. The children took part in experiments and wrote up a recent reports about their experiences.

Pupil also had the opportunity to dress up as their favourite character during World Book Day. Competitions took place during the week.

Pupils also enjoyed science week where learning took place through investigations. These investigations were planned in detail and all the children enjoyed taking part.

In Summer term all pupils took part in sports day. These activities were all planned by Mr. Hitchinson, which took a lot of hard work and dedication. Well done Mr. Hitchinson.





<u>Year 2</u>

Wow! What an eventful half term it has been for Year 2. The children had a fantastic time at Kidzania. They were able to explore the indoor theme park and role play different jobs like fireman, doctor, police officer, journalist and more. The children learnt how society functions, financial literacy, adult professions, team work, independence, self-esteem and real-life skills.

In English, the children learnt to write different types of writing texts. The children were able to use descriptive language to write a setting description based on our text 'The Great Kapok Tree'. To really immerse children in the story, towards the end of the term, the children focused on persuasive writing. The children had the opportunity to explore persuasive language features and write their own persuasive letter.

In Maths, the children explored the topic of measurement. They were able to understand key concepts of weight and mass and use key vocabulary to describe two objects, such as heavy, light, heavier than, lighter than. The children were able to use their knowledge of measuring mass in grams to start to measure mass in kilograms. They were able to apply counting in 2s, 5s and 10s to measure on different scales. To end our topic of measurement, the children were able to compare the volume of containers and use the language quarter, half, and three quarters full to describe and compare volume.

In Science, the children have been exploring all about plants. They enjoyed learning about the functions of plants and germination. The children were able to plant different seeds and write a diary to explain the growth over time. On 28th June, the children took part in Sports Day. They had a fantastic time showcasing all the sports they have learnt throughout the year in different activities. It was brilliant to see how well the children worked together as a team, cheering their friends and supporting them, when needed. Great teamwork skills!

Year 3

This Summer Term has been filled with fantastic learning opportunities from workshops all the way to visiting the Natural History Museum. In Science, we have been focusing on Rocks and Fossils and we became palaeontologists when creating cast fossils and excavating them. Furthermore, we investigated the Rock Cycle by representing this with Starbursts and linking this to the three types of rocks.

In Topic, whilst exploring the Stone Age, we investigated what people used to eat as part of their diet. As scientists, we dissected faeces to unpick parts of undigested foods! It was terribly exciting for us all! We found evidence of berries, fish bones, nuts, beans and seeds.

Our Class Reading Journal is full of exciting books that we enjoy reading. It has been fantastic sharing our journals with the class and celebrating pleasure for reading together. You will start a new journal in Year 4! This has been Mrs Kochhar's most memorable moments of the year.

Sports Day was a great success with us all participating and enjoying each activity. It was wonderful to see some of our family members cheering us on too!

It has been a great honour teaching you all this year and we wish you the very best for Year Four. We hope that your summer is filled with joy, laughter and many fun memories.











The second half of the summer half term has been full of many great electrifying educational experiences for Year 4. In English we have been reading The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane. We have written some remarkable diary entries and poems based on our reading.

The highlight of this term was Go Ape. Even though, it was a scorching 33 degrees, the children overcame these barriers and their fear of heights to complete the net adventures. They thoroughly enjoyed walking through Black Park and admiring nature and liked playing different outdoor activities before cooling down in the playground.

Additionally, sports day was delight. It was full of adrenaline fuelled activities from long jump to nerf guns. The children were challenged in all areas of physical education. Thank you to all the parents and teachers that took part in the races, this was a highlight for the children. In maths children have really enjoyed learning the geometry strand. We looked at area and perimeter. Furthermore, we look at symmetry and tessellation. The children had practical maths lesson in which they created shapes and used mirrors to find items that are symmetrical.

In science we have been exploring electricity. We have learnt how to keep safe around electricity. This topic was full of practical experiments, such as testing insulators and conductors and diagnosing circuits that didn't work. Furthermore, in Topic we have been learning about our local area. We have enjoyed exploring and researching about the pros and cons of Heathrow airport and how it was created. We looked at why our area is the best fit for Heathrow to be created.

In Jam Coding, children have been using a software named Scratch to create a game for their peers to play. They have explored aspects of coding for this. In Spanish we have been learning about modes of travel and how to plan a holiday to Spain. We looked at different cities in Spain.

Throughout, this year we have been developing our music skills in playing the cornet, and have spent this term mastering our piece for the music concert. The children are excited and are looking forward to sharing this with everyone.

We took part in Picture News day in which the children took part in virtual lessons throughout the day. They were guided to create an abstract art piece and were able to meet a special guest, Jill Eagle (artist) who discussed how to create an art exhibition.

Scopay Lunch Bookings

Please can we make a humble request to ALL parents to complete this for their child/children too. Every parent needs to log in to Scopay and book their child's meal choices for the week or term. Reception, Year 1 and 2 children are entitled to receive Universal Free School Meals so there will be no costs incurred in your child's Scopay account. If your child is bringing a packed lunch you still need to book this in as P code.

The cost for a school meal is £2.35 per day for children in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 (any child/children that are on Pupil Premium will be exempt from paying). Please kindly ensure your child's dinner account is topped up regularly.
