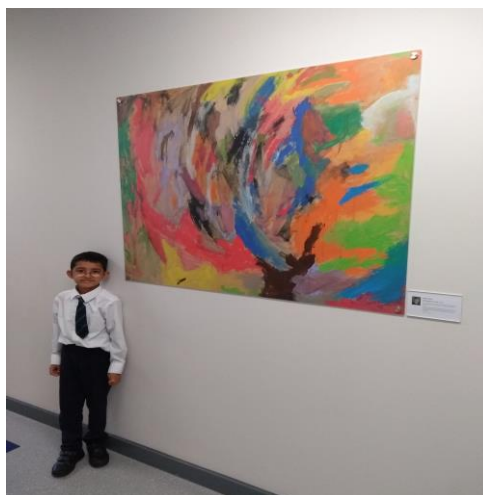

This Term's Learning

Reception – Newton Class

WOW! The term has flown by and Newton class have been on so many adventures. We have explored the wonderful woods in the story of 'Owl Babies', made our very own birds nest and created woodland art using twigs and leaves, we have danced like skeletons with the funny bones characters, and we even found a dinosaur egg in the playground!

We have become FANTASTIC at phonics, learning so many sounds and blending words with our friend 'Fred' the frog who always needs our help to blend the sounds as he doesn't know how!

Reception – Bell Class

In Reception this term, the children have had lots of fun doing a wide range of different activities both indoors and outdoors. In phonics, we have been learning the beginning sounds of words and learning to blend words together. The highlight of our learning so far has been the discovery of an egg in our garden. The children were very excited to explore what might emerge from the egg. The egg has recently hatched and we have found out that it is a dinosaur egg! We have had some fun and engaging P.E. lessons where we learnt catching and throwing skills and how to move our body in different ways



Year 1 – Watson Class

In Watson class we've been learning about Jack and The Beanstalk. In Science we planted broad beans and we are currently keeping a diary of our plants.



Year 1 – Franklin Class

This half term, Year 1 have been learning about plants in Science and the story of Jack and The Beanstalk during English. The children enjoyed making pizzas using basil as a topping. This is a cross curricular link



Year 2 – Pasteur Class

Children in Pasteur Class have thoroughly enjoyed learning through practical activity. They have enjoyed learning addition and subtraction facts by using practical resources such as dienes and numicon to support them. Slime making was an absolute joy for children in Pasteur class! Children were able to use practical games and activities to extend their knowledge on materials.



Year 2 – Fleming Class

In Fleming Class this term, we have worked incredibly hard! We really enjoyed our Science learning during Healthy Eating Week and shared some fantastic examples of keeping a healthy mind and body. The practical investigations we completed on testing Materials encouraged us to make sensible predictions and to compare results. Our practical learning during Diwali was fun because we did acting and got to make Rangoli patterns from rice and Diva lamps from clay. Well done Fleming Class!



Year 3 – Curie Class

This half term has been great! We have eased back into our busy school routines and Curie class have been extremely determined and motivated to close any learning gaps between year 2 and 3. I am extremely proud of their progress and dedication to their learning. We have delved into the world of plants, travelled to Trinidad and Tobago and cracked many tricky multi-step word problems. Year 3 – Faraday Class

This half term Faraday class have been working hard to get back into the routine of school life. We have explored plants in science and explored character's emotions in English. In topic, we explored Trinidad and Tobago and compared it to life in England. We have also been focusing on what we need to do to be healthy, running a mile drinking lots of water, taking time to colour in our mindful colouring's and discussing what we should eat to stay healthy. Year 4 – Goodall Class

This half-term, Year 4 classes have been fully immersed in our topic 'The Rainforests' linked with English. Children have produced extended writing using diary entries, letters and non-chronological reports on Rainforests. In Science, we have been learning about habitats and making use of the good weather outside; we have managed to get a lot of outdoor learning this half-term.



Year 4 – Carson Class

The children have been learning about different types of habitats, the organisms that live there, why they have certain adaptations as well as how the environment affects the species as a whole. In Art, children have created rainforest animals using different art forms such as Zetangle animals, aboriginal art form, mosaics and symmetry drawings. Lastly, we have reintroduced Times Table Rockstars which many children have thoroughly enjoyed playing.
